This Sunday: This Sunday the ride is "Circling San Fernando" which is our century and metric century of the month. All routes start with a climb up Sepulveda and a trip east along Mulholland Drive and then down into the Burbank area. Each route then makes a circle around the San Fernando Valley. The other two routes make truncated circles around the Valley and each return back over Sepulveda. **Only Photo:** I wouldn't have any photos this week except **Sandy Weiner** sent me this photo from last Thursday's Triple Dipper Ride.




