Hello All:



Sunday: We were riding the "Orange Coast Tour" which started in Huntington Beach. There were 7 riders and I took this shot at the start:

This Sunday: This Sunday we will be riding the "Whale of a Century" which is our century and metric century for the month of August. We used to ride this one early in the year, but they are ideal summer routes because they hug the coast most of the day. Unlike most of our summer routes, these go north instead of south. Starting from Carmarillo (full century) or Ventura (metric century) we ride north along the coast to Santa Barbara and return. In Santa Barbara we make a small loop taking us up to the Museum of Natural History where we view the whale skeleton that give the ride its name. The ride has two different start locations and two different start times. This allows the metric riders to do the center (and best) portion of the full century. I plan to ride the metric but I may skip the loop in Santa Barbara unless I'm feeling particularly good that day.

Meeting: The August meeting of members is this Thursday, the 15th, at 7:00 p.m. We have a new host this month -- Andy Pollack. This is the first meeting since the Grand Tour so we should get a report. There will no doubt be other things to discuss. And of course there will be plenty of good gossip and refreshments.
