

# DEATH VALLEY





## **Prospect Park Century**

Location: Brooklyn, New York



Their ride is only 29 laps around Prospect Park in Brooklyn but judging by the profile at the bottom each lap includes just about the same amount of climbing as our Rose Bowl Century. Looks like their route might be a bit more scenic with that lake at the southern end of the loop. Also looks like they ride counterclockwise -- probably because they are on a bike only path and don't have to compete with auto traffic as we do at the Rose Bowl. Counterclockwise is the way most racing is done -- both horse and auto -- so maybe that makes sense. I once looked up why oval racing is done in that direction but I forget now what the answer was.
