Los Angeles Wheelmen VP Report - January 7, 2025


Hello All:




In return, Mike took this shot of David, standing in front of the Illinois float, because I'm from Illinois.




Looks like they had a good day.

This Week: This Sunday we will be riding the "Santa Fe Dam" ride which starts from Barnes Park in Monterey Park. All three routes ride over to the Santa Fe Dam and then ride the almost 3 mile crest of the dam and continue on through some of the wilderness area behind the dam. Soon after that, the short splits off for a direct return to the start. The long and the medium ride over to Pasadena for lunch. I've moved the lunch location a bit -- you'll never guess where -- well actually, you only get one guess. After lunch, the long splits off to do a fairly good climb up to the top of Lake Avenue (the highest paved street in Pasadena) before returning back to the start via a trip past the Rose Bowl. 2024 Achievements: A few more of you have submitted your riding accomplishments for 2024

Ira Kucheck rode 9022.6 miles over 235 days of riding. That's riding almost two thirds of the days in the year. I sure wish I could get out that often.

Post-Holiday Party. As a reminder, our post-holiday party will be Saturday, January 25th. I plan to send out a formal invitation tomorrow. Look for it.


