This Week: This Sunday we will be riding "South Bay Surprise" which starts from Torrance. All routes head east and then circle back through Long Beach. The longer the route, the further east it goes with the long going all the way to Knott's Berry Farm. These are fairly flat rides. 2024 Riding Stats: Two more members have reported their 2024 riding statistics:

Howard Wedin: Howard rode 6339 miles and climbed 167,342 feet in a whopping 338 rides. That's riding almost every day. I had no idea he got out that often.

Dale Aaronson: Dale rode 7253 miles and climbed 431,492 feet in only 89 rides. That's an amazing amount of climbing -- not far from a vertical century -- and in only 89 rides.

Route Changes Due to Fires: I have been working on the February ride schedule (due to go out soon) and I have changed 3 of the 4 routes which I listed in the Proposed February Schedule at the end of the January Schedule. The proposed "Arcadia La Tuna" ride for February 2nd goes right through the Eaton Canyon Fire area, so that has been changed to "Long Beach Boogie." "Santa

Anita Canyon" which I had tentatively scheduled for February 9th goes up to Chantry Flats. After years of being closed, it had been reopened, but now the fire has closed it again. So I am substituting "Cal Poly By Golly." On February 16th, I had proposed the "Camarillo Centuries" but these use both Topanga Canyon and a lot of PCH. I suspect that by mid-February, these areas will be clear for riding again, but I don't want to take the chance, so I have scheduled the "Triple Dam Centuries" instead. Between the landslide closure in Palos Verdes and the fires, it is really getting hard to schedule our rides. At least the roads closed by the fires will probably soon open.
