Last Sunday we were riding the Gateway Bridge down in Long Beach so for our theme music tonight here is maybe the best "bridge" related song I know of:




Here's a shot from Hoy showing the channel the bridge actually goes over.

Looks like a real rust bucket. If you are wondering how a Russian sub ended up in Long Beach, here is a Wikipedia page about the sub




